DUAL CREDIT VS. DUAL ENROLLMENT

Dual Credit - students are enrolled in the high school earning college credit and high school credit concurrently.

Dual Enrollment - students are enrolled in the high school and taking courses on the college campus



PROS AND CONS OF DUAL CREDIT/ENROLLMENT





Pros

- -Earn H.S. Credit and College
- -College level rigor
- -Helps students find right career path
- -Helps Expedite College Degree completion
- -Cost Effectiveness about 1/3 of the cost, saves money
- -Lowers Remediation Rates

Cons

- -Registration process semester at HS and College don't match up
- -Transferability of credits
- -Rigor of courses
- -Grades become permanent records on college transcript

- Savings of \$1,190
- Promotes Student Retention and Completion
- Reduces Remediation Rates
- Experience of College Rigor

- 1. On-Campus Experience Tuition Free \$60 Student Fee
- 2. Juniors and Seniors with 3.25 GPA
- 3. May Take up to Two Classes Each Semester
- 4. Total of 24 Credits 1 full year
- 5. Class/Schedule Availability work with HHS School Counselor
- 6. Students Purchase Textbooks and pay additional fees
- 7. Courses are not dual enrollment classes
- 8. Eliminates Cost Barriers
- 9. Promotes Retention and Completion
- 10. Apply Online (/apply/carroll-early-access-application)
