Overview:

- 1. Help your student identify interests, majors, career programs, and colleges by using MCIS
- 2. Assist your student in connecting with someone who works in the careers of interest. Mrs. Strietzel can connect students to internships and/or job shadowing
- 3. Visit college campuses and technical centers to learn more about the environment and best fit (allowed 2 school-related absences a year). Research online if a visit is not possible
- 4. Encourage student to use resources at the counseling center and online
- 5. Look for the most economically feasible option for your goals. Options include community colleges, trade centers, and apprenticeships.

When it comes to choosing the right college, there are a lot of factors to consider.

The process involves looking at colleges from all angles and determining the right fit based on a combination of facts and "gut" feeling

Factors to consider might include:

- Academic Fit
- Cultural Fit (weather, campus setting, size, extracurricular, diversity)
- Financial Fit

Grants and Loans

- The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the form that the federal government, states, colleges and other organizations use to award financial aid. Submitting it is your key to accessing grants, scholarships, work-study programs and student loans.
- Fill out the application each year you're in college it only takes 30 minutes on average to complete when you're prepared.
- The FAFSA will be available on October 1 and you will be able to use your prior-prior year's taxes (2018) to complete the application. Most Montana schools set their priority FAFSA date for the 2020-21 academic year as December 1.
- Be sure to confirm that date with your college of choice. It's a good idea to complete the <u>FAFSA</u> as soon after Oct. 1 as possible to ensure the best financial aid opportunities.

FAFSA OPENS OCTOBER 1ST!

STEP 1: APPLY FOR A FSA ID

- The FSA ID is your legal signature for submitting the FAFSA. Both a parent and the student will need an ID
- You'll use your FSA ID every year you fill out a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form
- Visit **StudentAid.gov/fsaid** to create a FSA ID. You'll need your Social Security number, full name, and date of birth. You'll also need to create a memorable username and password, and provide answers to some challenge questions so you can retrieve your account information if you forget it.

Step 2: Submit the FAFSA
