

From the Desk of the School Nurse: First Aid for an Eye Injury

Having an accident that involves your student's eyes can be stressful. Knowing what to do quickly may prevent further damage and preserve vision.

Prevention: Consider all eye injuries as serious; see an eye doctor promptly.

Have your student wear appropriate eye protection for hazardous activities and sports at school, home and on the job that could lead to an eye injury.

Stock a first aid kit with eyewash (make sure it is not expired) before engaging in activities where an eye injury could occur.

First-Aid for Eye Injuries

Chemical Burns—Eye Injury from chemical exposure

- Immediately flush the eye with water. Hold the eye under a faucet, shower or pour water into the eye using a clean container. Keep the eye open as wide as possible during flushing. Continue flushing for 15 minutes.
- Flush over contact lenses immediately. If the contact does not flush out, gently remove the contact and continue to flush.
- DO NOT bandage the eye.
 After flushing, seek medical care.

Something in the Eye; Avoid rubbing the eye

- Flush eye gently with water, contact lens solution or commercial eye wash.
- Try lifting upper eyelid outward. Look down over the lower lid.
- DO NOT use tweezers or other items to try and remove the object. If the speck doesn't wash out, see an eye doctor immediately.

Blows to the Eye

• Apply cold compress without pressure in 5-10 intervals. Do not place ice directly on the eye. In cases of pain, blurry vision, blood inside the eye, or a "black eye", seek medical attention.

Cut Injuries of the Eye and Eyelid

- DO NOT wash out eye with water or any other liquid.
- DO NOT try to remove an object that is stuck in the eye.
- Cover the eye without pressure, using the bottom half of a paper cup, taped into place
- Have your student try to look straight ahead as looking around will move the injured eyeball as well.

Seek emergency medical care immediately.

Prescription medications:

Prescription medications are not allowed to be carried and self-administered by students unless you have supplied a **Montana Authorization to Possess or Self-Administer Asthma, Severe Allergy, or Anaphylaxis Medication** form for those applicable medications (epi-pen, albuterol inhaler) per Helena Public Schools medication policy 3070. See your HHS student handbook, pg 32-35. Please call Emily Rodway RN @ 324-2216 to discuss prescription medications at school.

Over-the-counter medications:

Students are permitted to possess their own over-the-counter medications such as Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Midol, Tums, etc. These are not supplied by our school staff so please help your <u>student</u> be prepared by making sure they have a small bottle in their backpack for their own use as needed.

Label all medications:

Occasionally a student drops their medications. Please label all medications that are not labeled such as inhalers so we can return medications back to students. Students can check in with me in the Health Room if they are missing a medication.
