HHS recently had several students awarded **National Recognition from College Board** under their "National Rural and Small Town Award (NRSTA). These students earned this recognition because of their academic achievements in school and outstanding performance on the PSAT and/or AP Exams. Congratulations goes out to Aine Cleary, Ashely Koenig, Avery Sanders, Brynn Woodmansey, Jackson Littrup, Jonathon Abel, Khalil Elias, Kylee Gardipee, Nolan Verrill, Ryan Maus, and Samuel Schiltz.

In some additional great news, several students received recognition from College Board based on their performance on their AP Assessments last year. The three categories include: **AP Scholar**= Scores of 3 or higher on 3 or more AP Exams; **AP Scholar with Honors**= Average score of 3.25 on all AP Exams taken and scores of 3 or higher on 4 or more AP Exams and **AP Scholar with Distinction**= Average Score of at least a 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on 5 or more of these exams. HHS had 28 students meet the criteria for AP Scholar, 6 students met the criteria for AP Scholar with Honors and 15 students met the criteria for AP Scholar with Distinction. We are so proud of the performance of these high achieving students and their dedicated teachers.

SLIPS, TRIPS AND FALLS REMINDER BULLETIN HELENA SCHOOL DISTRICT

Plan ahead and give yourself sufficient time.

When walking on steps always use the hand railings and plant your feet firmly on each step.

When walking on an icy or snow-covered walkway, take short steps and walk at a slower pace so you can react quickly to a change in traction.

Bending your knees a little and taking slower and shorter steps increases traction and can greatly reduce your chances of falling. It also helps to stop occasionally to break momentum.

Streets and sidewalks that have been cleared of snow and ice should still be approached with caution.

Look out for "black ice." Dew, fog or water vapor can freeze on cold surfaces and form an extra-thin, nearly invisible layer of ice that can look like a wet spot on the pavement. It often shows up early in the morning or in areas that are shaded from the sun.

Carrying heavy items can challenge your sense of balance. Try not to carry too much--you need to



Use special care when entering and exiting vehicles--use the vehicle for support.

Never underestimate the importance of reporting a near miss! A near miss is an unplanned event that did not result in injury or property damage but HAD the potential to be a significant accident. By reporting near misses, we can correct hazardous situations before an incident occurs.

At Helena High, we use data to guide our efforts in ensuring the success of every student. Each month, we'll share a snapshot of the data we work with to keep you informed about our focus.

Our teachers are in high gear now that October is behind us. As a School Leadership Team (SLT), we have been gathering data on engagement strategies used by our teachers to keep students focused and active in class. We all know it takes some clever methods to keep teenagers engaged for an entire class!

One of these methods is artificial intelligence (AI), which was the focus of our recent "Grab-n-Go" Professional Development. Teachers grabbed a treat and scanned a code for an article on using AI tools in the classroom.
