Benchmark Assessments this Week:

This week we will be spending some time to conduct our fall benchmarking assessments for our 9th-11th graders. Our 12th graders will spend the time during the assessment block hearing from Josten's on ordering senior shirts and graduation caps and gowns, reminders from our counseling staff, and connecting with our counselors to do last checks on whether their schedules are set to ensure they will graduate on time.

For our testing, we are switching to the MAP test this year. The Measure of Academic Progress Assessment will serve as a diagnostic assessment in both math and reading for our 9th and 10th grade students. All 9th and 10th graders will be expected to take this assessment on these two days. The data from these assessments will help us have a better understanding of your child's current level of proficiency and help with any potential placement changes that need to take place for them to receive the correct level of resources needed.

Juniors will be starting the ACT Prep practice assessment during this time. These practice assessments will be utilized at points throughout the year to help students get more experiences with the testing format, the types of questions and content they may see on the ACT in the Spring, and to help our planning to ensure we are shoring up any shortcomings with our students so they are prepared for the test in April.

Please remind your child to have their Chromebook and charger with them for these two days and to plug it in the night before, so it is ready to go in the morning. If you have any questions on these assessments, please reach out.

What's Going on in Class?

We look forward to finding an effective, streamlined way to communicate with you regularly on what is happening in our classes. We ask that you bear with us as we fine-tune our formatting for these messages but hope that the information provided helps you get a glimpse of what your child is learning in class and what major assignments, projects, and units are coming up for the month. Each department has been tasked with providing information to answer the following three questions:

1. What are the major units/topics that will be covered the next four weeks?


2. What major assignments, projects, or tests are coming up in the next four weeks?

• *Parking Passes* - We still have passes left in the red and yellow lots. If you have not purchased a parking pass yet, please do so asap. Door Dash and Other Food Delivery Services Policy

While we still will allow students to order food to the school for the 2024-2025 school year, we do have a few reminders on how this works at HHS:

- Students will only be allowed to pick up food or drinks from the main office during the scheduled lunch period. Students will not be allowed to leave class to go to the office to pick up food, coffee, etc.
- If food is not here by the time the lunch period is over, it is likely they will not have an opportunity to pick that up until the end of the day.

We highly encourage you to not use Door Dash, Uber Eats, or any other delivery services for your lunch option, mainly due to the reality that times fluctuate with when they are able to pick up the food and get it to the school and we want to make sure students have an opportunity to eat during that scheduled time. We do have great options available at the school for lunch. Our School Food Service offers affordable meals each day in our cafeteria and our student-ran Catty Shack also provides a variety of options for students who may need something for the day. Both are great alternatives to using the delivery services.

We appreciate your consideration with this and understanding of this.




Booster Club Support Opportunities

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

As mentioned, we recognize that there are always extenuating circumstances that arise, but our hope this year is we can continue to work together to build student attendance in school.

The second part of absenteeism is getting to class on time. While this has been better overall so far this year, tardies continue to be an area of concern. Even though it may not

seem like much to be 5 or 6 minutes late each day, all those minutes eventually add up to a significant amount of lost instruction time that can be detrimental to the understanding of material and ability to engage with instructors.



Teens and Vaping

Vaping continues to be an incredible issue at schools across the state and nation. Each year vapes become more and more prevalent in schools and it is important that we work collectively to help inform our students on the harmful health effects associated with vaping.

Let's Talk Academics and Growth at HHS

Day in and day out, it is encouraging to see the engagement happening in our classrooms at HHS to help our students be college and career ready by the time they leave our doors. Much of this work is centered around the desire of our students to want to succeed and be prepared for their next chapter in life, but also through the hard work and countless hours put in by our teaching staff to stay on top of the best practices in their content and teaching methods to help students engage and learn each day.

Each month this year, we will be sharing out on student growth to help demonstrate the importance of taking education seriously, but to also celebrate the results of the hard work of everyone here at HHS! We also recognize there are many aspects that contribute to educating the whole child and each person can show growth in multiple ways. We will attempt to share as many aspects as possible of the various stories as we can.

To start off, each year, interested Juniors are given the opportunity to take the PSAT-NMSQT test. This test serves as another practice opportunity in a timed, high stakes testing environment, but also serves as the qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarship. Helena High has historically had a great history with students meeting the threshold of qualifying as semi-finalists and finalists for the scholarship. Based on the data from the National Merit Scholarship Committee, roughly 50,000 of the 1.3 million students who take the test are recognized as semifinalists, and two of those this year are HHS students! We are excited for these two individuals to work through the scholarship application process and hopefully become finalists, making them eligible for the scholarship recognition! As mentioned, we recognize that there are always extenuating circumstances that arise, but our hope this year is we can continue to work together to build student attendance in school.

The second part of absenteeism is getting to class on time. While this has been better overall so far this year, tardies continue to be an area of concern. Even though it may not seem like much to be 5 or 6 minutes late each day, all those minutes eventually add up to a significant amount of lost instruction time that can be detrimental to the understanding of material and ability to engage with instructors.

Attendance Support

With the start of the new year and new secretaries in the attendance office, we appreciate your patience as we adjust to these positions and how we have it staffed. We do ask that you review the reminders below:

- When calling to excuse your child for the day or to get them out for an appointment and need to leave a message, please make sure you include and spell their last name in the message.
- If you are calling to excuse your child for an appointment, please excuse them for the time they need to leave in order to get to their appointment on time.
- If you know your child has an appointment coming up, you are welcome to call before the day of the appointment to excuse them.
- If your child has a recurring appointment, we are happy to work with you on a plan for that, so you do not need to call in each day to excuse them.
- All students need to sign out and sign back in if they are leaving for an appointment. If you are picking up for an appointment, the best place to do so is the drop off loop on the north side of the building. Students need to stop by the attendance office by the cafeteria to sign out.
